

2023 Youth Python Roundup

2023 Youth Python Roundup was a successful and enjoyable event in the Everglades, organized by the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC) and the South Florida Water Management District (SFWM) in collaboration with the Youth Hunting Program of Florida (YHPF) and the Florida Sportsmen's Conservation Association (FSCA).

The event began with an educational program led by McKayla Spencer, a member of the FWC Python Team, who provided valuable information about Burmese pythons and their impact on the Everglades ecosystem. The participants, including the youth hunters, were then given live capture training by the FWC before heading out into the Everglades to remove the invasive pythons.

Throughout the event, the youth hunters and other participants had a chance to experience the beauty of the Everglades while engaging in activities such as fishing for Peacock Bass and observing native wildlife, including a female alligator on her nest.

In total, four Burmese pythons were harvested during the hunt, with the largest snake measuring 10'2" and the smallest measuring 27". Removing these harmful invaders is crucial for the conservation of the Everglades ecosystem and the protection of native Florida wildlife.

The success of the event was attributed to the collaboration of various organizations and individuals, including Python Contractors, SFWMD Staff, and the FWC Python Management Team. The Youth Hunt Program was commended for its role in teaching young generations to be ethical sportsmen and stewards of the land.

Big thanks to python contractors from SFWMD Ozzie Gonzalez, Bayo Hernandez and FWC contractors Anne Vega, Matthew Kogo and Tom Rahill. FWC youth hunting guide from (YHPF) Billy Boatwright, Steve Stroh, Lauresa Musgrove, Kyle Shaffer, and Justin Lovellette

As the Huntmaster and a volunteer for the Youth Hunting Program of Florida for 19 years, Bishop Wright Jr. expressed gratitude to all involved and looked forward to another successful hunt in the following year.

Overall, the 2023 Youth Python Roundup was a meaningful and impactful event that contributed to the preservation of the Everglades and educated the youth about responsible wildlife conservation

WINNERS NEVER QUIT is back in the Marsh

Front Yard Airboat rebuild, the airboat is constructed using Hickman templates of a Palm Beach riveted open hull with side boards, hunt style metal works. The engine is a Lycoming Upstack I0540 Aircraft Engine 300hp built by Tom Schmidt, and it is paired with a brand new new 72" NGQ Sensenich Propeller. Fuel and oil lines along with the push pull cables were designed and put on at Mako Hose & Rubber. Single front and rear seats with matching cushions and rain slips by Outdoor Creative Designs. The entire process has been a labor of love, and I'm grateful for the support of my friends and their dedication to the Gladesmen culture.





The hull of this airboat is constructed using 6061-T6 Aluminum Sheet and aluminum T-bar $2 \times 2 \times 1/4$ inches. It is heavily riveted, and the bottom surface is coated with black Polymer using old-school steel flex technology. The seat structure is made of aluminum with air ride functionality, and there are fiberglass seat shells with conduit guards, a steel motor stand is included in the construction.

My dad "Bishop Sr." built a single airfoil rubber using his own templates. This custom-made rubber hold special value and sentimental meaning. I can certainly appreciate the sentiment behind my dad's creation. It's fantastic that I have something so distinctive and cherishable, and I hope it brings me joy of the memory working with him on this project for years to come.

The project began in June of 2020 when the previous airboat, which was built in 1997, started showing signs of wear and tear. Instead of rebuilding it for the third time, so I decided to start from scratch. Disassembled the old boat, salvaged the usable parts, and used them to create this new airboat.

The Gladesmen culture is a unique and cherished part of American heritage, particularly in the Florida Everglades region. Gladesmen are known for their deep connection to the natural environment and their self-reliant way of life. The tradition of American craftsmanship and

Palm Beach style boats are specially designed to navigate the shallow waters and marshy terrain of the Everglades. They typically feature a flat bottom and rounded sides, allowing them to glide through the water and vegetation with ease. These boats have become an iconic symbol of the Gladesmen culture and are essential for their way of life, enabling them to explore, hunt, fish, and navigate the unique ecosystem of the Everglades.





The sense of community and mutual support among Gladesmen is a core aspect of their culture. They come together to help each other with various tasks, whether it's repairing boats, sharing knowledge and techniques, or assisting during challenging situations in the wilderness. This camaraderie allows them to preserve their way of life and ensure that future generations can also experience and appreciate the Gladesmen culture.

For those who embrace the Gladesmen lifestyle, it becomes an integral part of their identity. It represents a deep connection to nature, self-sufficiency, and a sense of belonging to a tight-knit community. A old friend of mine, Frank Dienager, who is a true Gladesmen, shared some wisdom with me about the airboat community. He mentioned that the problem arose when people started building airboats for profit, rather than as a hobby in their own yards. According to him, this shift in motivation led to a lack of understanding and appreciation for the Gladesmen culture. I agree with this sentiment, as I find it true in many aspects of Air boating today.

Overall my friend and family have poured a lot of effort, time, and dedication into this Airboat rebuild, and Caroll and I are grateful for the support of your friends throughout the process.

Bishop's Gator Fritters Recipe

Here's a recipe for Gator Fritters using Uncle Buck's Hush Puppy Mix and Uncle Buck's Cornbread Mix: (purchased from Bass Pro Shops)
Ingredients:

- 1 container of Uncle Buck's Hush Puppy Mix
- 1 container of Uncle Buck's Cornbread Mix
- 1 pound of ground gator meat
- 3 zucchini squash, chopped
- 3 yellow squash, chopped
- Everglades seasoning (or seasoning of your choice)
- Vegetable oil for frying

Instructions:

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the Uncle Buck's Hush Puppy Mix and Uncle Buck's Cornbread Mix in equal parts, following the instructions on the packages. This should give you a 50-50 mix.
- 2. Cook the ground gator meat in a skillet over medium heat until thoroughly cooked. Drain any excess grease from the meat.
- **3.** Season the cooked gator meat with Everglades seasoning or any seasoning of your choice. Mix well to coat the meat evenly.
- 4. Add the chopped zucchini squash and yellow squash to the bowl with the hush puppy and cornbread mix.
- 5. Add the seasoned gator meat to the bowl as well. Mix all the ingredients together until well combined.
- 6. Place the mixture in the refrigerator and let it chill for at least one hour. Chilling the mixture helps it hold together better when frying.
- 7. After chilling, heat vegetable oil in a deep skillet or pot for frying. Make sure there is enough oil to fully submerge the fritters.
- 8. Use a spoon or an ice cream scoop to portion out the chilled mixture into small balls or patties.
- 9. Carefully drop the fritters into the hot oil and fry them until they turn golden brown and crispy. This should take about 3-4 minutes per batch.
- 10. Once cooked, remove the fritters from the oil and place them on a paper towel-lined plate to drain any excess oil.
- 11. Serve the gator fritters hot as an appetizer or main dish. They can be enjoyed plain or with a dipping sauce of your choice.

Note: Be cautious when working with hot oil and frying. Make sure to follow safety guidelines and use proper equipment.

Recreational Public Forum Meeting


The Recreational Public Forum meeting on September 25, 2023, regarding public recreational issues and opportunities within the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) was informative and productive. Here's a summary of what happened during the meeting:

- Opening Remarks: Drew Bartlett, Executive Director of SFWMD, and Newton Cook, the Facilitator, welcomed everyone and provided their opening remarks. It's great to see the executive Director involved when the top man in charge sits at the table with pen and paper. You know everybody is listening and brainstorming.
- Roundtable Introduction: Participants at the meeting, mainly recreational users of South Florida's water management land, as well as staff members from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFW), Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC), and SFWMD, introduced themselves.
- Veronica Kelly Visitor Services Plan Initiatives: Veronica Kelly, a
 Park Ranger from Arthur R. Marshall Loxahatchee National Wildlife
 Refuge, presented an update on the Refuge's Visitor Services Plan
 Initiatives and Hunt Program. She discussed user statistics and
 harvest data over the last five years and provided insights into their
 plans for the following year.
- Ayounga Riddick Upper Chain of Lakes Land Management: Ayounga Riddick, Science Supervisor at SFWMD, gave an overview of the management practices on water management properties within Osceola, Polk, and Orange County. He recognized the efforts of volunteers from organizations like the Kissimmee River Valley Sportsman's Association and Osceola County Airboat Association for their contributions.
- Mike Kirkland Python Management: Mike Kirkland, a Senior Invasive Animal Biologist at SFWMD, provided a recap and overview

of the 2023 Florida Python Challenge. He updated the attendees on the SFWMD Python Management Program and highlighted the collaboration between SFWMD, the Park Service, and FWC to address the issue of invasive pythons.

- Greg Nolte Central Everglades Planning Project: Greg Nolte, Project
 Manager at SFWMD, discussed the Central Everglades Planning
 Project North Overview, specifically the L-5 Canal Improvements. He
 mentioned construction plans that would impact traffic patterns on
 the levee but emphasized that the changes were well thought out to
 benefit Sportsmen and Recreational Users.
- Mike Cheek Recreation Facility Design & Project Updates: Mike Cheek, Recreation Project Manager at SFWMD, provided updates on Recreation Facility Design and Projects. He highlighted the district's commitment to improving recreational facilities, such as cutting trails for duck hunters, building new roads, and adding campsites and a potential pavilion.
- Positive Roundtable Discussion: The meeting was characterized as a
 productive roundtable discussion involving users and employees
 from multiple agencies. The focus on recreation and the collaborative
 efforts of these agencies were appreciated, with a clear commitment
 to making recreation a top priority.

Overall, it seems like the meeting successfully addressed important recreational and conservation issues in the South Florida Water Management District, with a commitment to enhancing the recreational experience for users.



K-Man's Gator Cowder

- 3 lbs. ground gator
- 1 large sweet onion
- ½ stalk celery
- 1 lb. butter
- 2 cups carrots
- 2 quarts heavy cream
- 1 quart half & half
- 6-8 potatoes dice then 1/2" pieces

- Sauté gator with some butter
- · Boil potatoes and carrots together
