This hunt is especially special to us, as we were part of the efforts to create it, doing Earth Day cleanups using airboats and handmade tools to remove boardwalks and water-testing platforms left behind by colleges conducting studies inside the refuge. This was a collaborative effort involving many sportsmen's clubs, and I'm proud to have been part of it, especially for my then-teenage son, who is now 22 and has grown into a true conservationist and sportsman in every sense of the word. I'm attaching pictures. The 1st is a screenshot of a local news story shot inside the refuge on 4/27/2017 at one of our cleanups, and both my son and I are in that picture along with my airboat (he was 13 years old at the time). Seminole Tribe and Conservation Partners

Visit Successful Nutrient Reduction Project at Lake Istokpoga

The Cypress Chapter of the Izaak Walton League of America (Cypress IWLA), Lake O Airboat Association, Florida Airboat Association, and Florida Sportsmen's Conservation Association recently hosted Seminole Tribe of Florida Chairman Marcelus Osceola and a delegation of Tribal leadership for a field visit to the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD) / Aquaculture Nutrient Reduction Project on Lake Istokpoga. The project is one of many projects included in the Northern Everglades and Estuary Protection Program.

Representatives from the Tribe's Departments of Operations, Agriculture, Environmental Protection, Conservation, Water Resources, and External Environmental Compliance, as well as the Tribe's environmental counsel from Lewis, Longman & Walker, P.A., were joined by Chairman Osceola. Together, they toured the ongoing project. This innovative effort combines aquatic vegetation management with nutrient mitigation and agricultural reuse.

The Lake Istokpoga project has successfully removed almost 25 million gallons of muck from the lake bottom, capturing an estimated 4,000 pounds of phosphorus and 90,000 pounds of nitrogen—a significant step toward improving water quality and restoring habitat. The harvested material is converted into a nutrient-rich soil amendment applied to local ranchlands, providing tangible benefits to both the environment and agriculture.

During the visit, the delegation met with the participating landowner, who expressed his satisfaction with the soil amendment's results and the improvement it has brought to his pastures and cow-calf operation.

Representatives from the sportsmen's community engaged in meaningful conversations with Tribal and NGO partners about the importance of collaboration among conservation, agriculture, and traditional land stewardship. The success at Lake Istokpoga clearly demonstrates how Florida's conservation challenges can be met through cooperation, innovation, and shared purpose
