**Opening remarks (Matt Nelson)**

**Treasures Report (Mark Dombrowski)**- Discussed current member total as well as sponsors for the Father's Day Shoot. Currently, we have 6 shoot teams and 1 sponsor.

**Treasures reports acceptance** -Motion made by Thomas McGoldrick; Seconded by Johnny Escobar.

**Minutes acceptance**- Thomas McGoldrick made a motion; Joe Rabena seconded.

## **Old Business**

**JW Corbett Cleanup (Thomas McGoldrick)** - Event was successful, with a huge turnout of volunteers. Various types of trash were removed, including hundreds of golf balls, buggy tires, and other items.

**Kissimmee River Workday (Johnny Escobar)**- 15 buggies attended, a skid steer, and 2 dump trailers. All fence posts were removed, and a bat wing was removed. The event ended around 4:30. 3 trips were made with the dump trailer.

**Outdoor Expo (Joe Rabena)** - Event was successful; Friday was slower, but Saturday and Sunday were busier. 632 emails were sent out to members.

**Deer Move Project (Matt Nelson)** - A report was sent out on the project; only 2 deer died. 42 deer released, 33 does and 9 bucks. 11 were pregnant. A map showing movement patterns was presented. No deaths were reported due to predators.

**Sportsman's Trust Meeting (Bishop Wright)**- First meeting held in a long time. U.S. Fish and Wildlife was present. Julie Morris was also present.

**Everglades Youth Camp Plant Removal (Bishop Wright)** - Removal went well; more work was done than anticipated. Conversations were had about spraying; machines were brought in to clean out the ponds and canals.

## **New Business**

**FSCA/NWTF Banquet (Thomas McGoldrick)** - 56 tickets sold as of now. Discussed last-minute needs and plans. Discussed tables; approximately 100-130 people expected to bring guns for raffles, etc., and discussed silent auction items.

**Buggy Issues in JW Corbett (Matt Nelson)**- A new rule was discussed about buggies in Corbett. Discussed the pros of buggies off-trail, particularly regarding dog training. Muzzleloader season harder to justify. Buggies are not allowed off named and numbered roads during muzzleloader season, and discussed permits for vehicles, buggies, etc. during the season. An ORV permit must be held by anyone operating a vehicle for hunting off the grade, and fines will be imposed for any illegal activity.

#### **2. Hunting ORV Permit Information — JW Corbett WMA**

##### **ORV Access & Permit System**

- Discussion regarding the new **Off-Road Vehicle (ORV) permit** for hunting purposes.
- The permit system was pursued as an alternative to more restrictive proposed rules that could have significantly limited responsible hunting-related vehicle access.
- The goal is to preserve responsible cross-country/off-road access while addressing concerns regarding property damage and misuse.

##### **Permit Process**

- Hunters will obtain the permit through the **Go Outdoors** system.
- The permit will be listed under the licenses and permits section.
- Applicants must review an educational presentation on appropriate ORV use and certify that they understand the requirements.
- **Permit cost: \$100.**
- The permit authorizes vehicle operation off designated roads/grades when permitted under the applicable hunting regulations.

##### **Seasons/Permitted Use**

- Current information indicates the permit will allow off-road use during **General Gun Season**.
- We discussed additional hunting seasons, including small game, archery, muzzleloader, and turkey.

- Muzzleloader access remains an ongoing issue, with continued efforts to identify a path toward restoring this access.

### **Responsible Use**

- Hunters are strongly encouraged to use the access that has been secured, but **use it responsibly and within all applicable rules.**
- Users should avoid unnecessary damage to roads, wetlands, vegetation, and other sensitive areas.
- The importance of recognizing that activities on the property are being closely monitored was emphasized.
- Responsible use is critical to maintaining current access and demonstrating that additional access can be managed appropriately.

### **Enforcement**

- The permit system is intended to distinguish legitimate hunting-related ORV use from recreational riding, joyriding, mudding, or other unauthorized activities.
  - The program discussed increased penalties for violations as an important component.
  - Hunters are encouraged to report observed violations through the appropriate law-enforcement/dispatch channels rather than attempting to handle violations themselves.
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### **3. Camping Extension After General Gun Season**

- Camping regulations were discussed.
  - Hunters will have **up to seven days following the close of General Gun Season** to remove camps and associated equipment from the field.
  - The extension gives hunters who remained in the field through the end of the season additional time to break down and remove their camps properly.
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### **4. Kissimmee River PUA Changes**

- Review of current and proposed changes involving the **Kissimmee River Public Use Area (PUA).**

- Discussion of how the changes may affect hunting, vehicle access, camping, and recreational use.
  - Continued monitoring and communication regarding implementation and future management decisions.
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## **5. U.S. Fish & Wildlife Properties Updates**

- Updates regarding **U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service properties**.
  - Discussion of current access, management practices, conservation priorities, and potential impacts on hunters and recreational users.
  - Continued advocacy for responsible public access while maintaining compliance with conservation requirements.
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## **6. Current Conservation Efforts**

### **Wetland & Habitat Protection**

- Wetlands were identified as a major conservation concern.
- Aerial observations and property surveys have documented areas of environmental impact.
- Responsible ORV operation is necessary to prevent additional damage and demonstrate that hunting access can coexist with conservation goals.

### **Small Game Hunting Impacts**

- Concerns were discussed about vehicle use during small game hunting, particularly when low water conditions cause vehicles to leave visible, persistent tracks.
- Members were encouraged to minimize unnecessary vehicle impacts and remain within established rules.

### **Unauthorized ORV Activity**

- Concerns continue regarding individuals using the property for purposes other than lawful hunting.
- Unauthorized recreational riding, mudding, and property damage can negatively affect legitimate hunting access.

- The group emphasized the importance of distinguishing responsible hunters from unauthorized recreational users.

### **Future Access**

- Continued responsible use of the property will be important in demonstrating that hunting-related ORV access can be successfully managed.
  - Maintaining and improving property conditions may also support future efforts to regain or expand access, including continued discussion regarding muzzleloader access.

### **Pledge of Allegiance (All)**

#### **1. Introduction — Matt Nelson**

- Introduction of **Matt Nelson**.
- Brief overview of his involvement and role in current conservation and hunting-access efforts.

#### **2. Hunting ORV Permit Information — JW Corbett WMA**

##### **ORV Access & Permit System**

- Discussion regarding the new **Off-Road Vehicle (ORV) permit** for hunting purposes.
- The permit system was pursued as an alternative to more restrictive proposed rules that could have significantly limited responsible hunting-related vehicle access.
- The goal is to preserve responsible cross-country/off-road access while addressing concerns regarding property damage and misuse.

##### **Permit Process**

- Hunters will obtain the permit through the **Go Outdoors** system.
- The permit will be listed under the licenses and permits section.
- Applicants must review an educational presentation on appropriate ORV use and certify that they understand the requirements.
- **Permit cost: \$100.**
- The permit authorizes vehicle operation off designated roads/grades when permitted under the applicable hunting regulations.

##### **Seasons/Permitted Use**

- Current information indicates the permit will allow off-road use during **General Gun Season**.
- We discussed additional hunting seasons, including small game, archery, muzzleloader, and turkey.

- Muzzleloader access remains an ongoing issue, with continued efforts to identify a path toward restoring this access.

### **Responsible Use**

- Hunters are strongly encouraged to use the access that has been secured, but **use it responsibly and within all applicable rules.**
- Users should avoid unnecessary damage to roads, wetlands, vegetation, and other sensitive areas.
- The importance of recognizing that activities on the property are being closely monitored was emphasized.
- Responsible use is critical to maintaining current access and demonstrating that additional access can be managed appropriately.

### **Enforcement**

- The permit system is intended to distinguish legitimate hunting-related ORV use from recreational riding, joyriding, mudding, or other unauthorized activities.
  - The program discussed increased penalties for violations as an important component.
  - Hunters are encouraged to report observed violations through the appropriate law-enforcement/dispatch channels rather than attempting to handle violations themselves.

### **3. Camping Extension After General Gun Season**

- Camping regulations were discussed.
  - Hunters will have **up to seven days following the close of General Gun Season** to remove camps and associated equipment from the field.
  - The extension gives hunters who remained in the field through the end of the season additional time to break down and remove their camps properly.
- 

### **4. Kissimmee River PUA Changes**

- Review of current and proposed changes involving the **Kissimmee River Public Use Area (PUA).**

- Discussion of how the changes may affect hunting, vehicle access, camping, and recreational use.
  - Continued monitoring and communication regarding implementation and future management decisions.
- 

## **5. U.S. Fish & Wildlife Properties Updates**

- Updates regarding **U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service properties**.
  - Discussion of current access, management practices, conservation priorities, and potential impacts on hunters and recreational users.
  - Continued advocacy for responsible public access while maintaining compliance with conservation requirements.

## **6. Current Conservation Efforts**

### **Wetland & Habitat Protection**

- Wetlands were identified as a major conservation concern.
- Aerial observations and property surveys have documented areas of environmental impact.
- Responsible ORV operation is necessary to prevent additional damage and demonstrate that hunting access can coexist with conservation goals.

### **Small Game Hunting Impacts**

- Concerns were discussed about vehicle use during small game hunting, particularly when low water conditions cause vehicles to leave visible, persistent tracks.
- Members were encouraged to minimize unnecessary vehicle impacts and remain within established rules.

### **Unauthorized ORV Activity**

- Concerns continue regarding individuals using the property for purposes other than lawful hunting.
- Unauthorized recreational riding, mudding, and property damage can negatively affect legitimate hunting access.

- The group emphasized the importance of distinguishing responsible hunters from unauthorized recreational users.

### **Future Access**

- Continued responsible use of the property will be important in demonstrating that hunting-related ORV access can be successfully managed.
  - Maintaining and improving property conditions may also support future efforts to regain or expand access, including continued discussion regarding muzzleloader access.

### **7. 20-Mile Bend Flood Park**

- Update on ongoing discussions with county commissioners regarding the proposed **20-Mile Bend flood park**.
  - The project may help provide an alternative area for recreational vehicle use and potentially reduce unauthorized ORV activity on conservation properties.
  - Continued advocacy and coordination with county officials will be necessary.

### **8. Signage & Public Education**

- Discussion regarding additional signage at property entrances.
  - Potential use of informational signs and/or billboards to educate visitors about:
    - Authorized activities
    - ORV regulations
    - Wetland protection
    - Hunting-only access requirements
    - Penalties for violations
    - Responsible property use
- 

### **9. Law Enforcement Coordination**

- The group emphasized continued communication with law enforcement and agency leadership.

- Enforcing the permit system and associated penalties will be important to the program's success.
  - Members were encouraged to report violations through the appropriate dispatch channels.
  - Do not confront individuals directly; allow law enforcement to address reported violations.
- 

## **10. Member Responsibilities**

Members and hunters were reminded:

- Follow all hunting and ORV regulations.
- Use permitted access responsibly.
- Avoid unnecessary damage to roads, wetlands, and habitat.
- Report observed violations through the appropriate channels.
- Remember that individual actions can affect future access for the entire hunting community.
